1 (iii) The spouse refused to testify at the previous trial on the basis of 2 the provisions of this section; **OR**

3 (3) A VIOLATION OF A PROTECTIVE ORDER UNDER § 4–509 OF THE 4 FAMILY LAW ARTICLE IN A PROCEEDING IN WHICH THE SPOUSE IS THE PETITIONER.

5 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall be construed to 6 apply only prospectively and may not be applied or interpreted to have any effect on or 7 application to any violation of a protective order occurring before the effective date of this 8 Act.

9 SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 10 October 1, 2019.
