BY repealing and reenacting, with amendments, Article – Transportation Section 21–902.2(a) Annotated Code of Maryland (2012 Replacement Volume and 2018 Supplement) SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows: Article - Transportation 21 - 902.2.In this section, "ignition interlock system" means a device that: (a) Connects a motor vehicle ignition system to a breath analyzer that (1) measures a driver's PERSON'S blood alcohol level; [and]
