# 18 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, 19 That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

1 (a) There is a promoter's permit.

2 (b) A for-profit organization shall obtain the permit from the Board before the 3 organization may [help] publicize, sell tickets for, organize, operate, produce, or stage an 4 event[:

(1)] at which alcoholic beverages are sold or served[; and

6 (2) that is conducted in conjunction with an organization that holds a 7 license issued under Subtitle 13, Part III of this title].

8 (c) The Board may adopt regulations establishing the requirements for 9 conducting an event described in subsection (b) of this section, including health and safety 10 standards to be met by a permit holder.

11 (d) The permit fee is:

12 (1) \$250, if the promoter expects that fewer than 1,000 individuals will 13 attend;

14 (2) \$600, if the promoter expects that from 1,001 to 3,000 individuals will 15 attend; and

16 (3) \$1,000, if the promoter expects that more than 3,000 individuals will 17 attend.

18 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect July1, 2019.
