A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

2 **Public Health – Cottage Food Products – Definition**

3 FOR the purpose of altering the definition of “cottage food product” to include certain food
4 sold in the State to retail food stores or food cooperatives; and generally relating to
5 cottage food products.

16 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,

17 That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

18 **Article – Health – General**

19 21–301.

20 (a) In this subtitle the following words have the meanings indicated.

21 (b–1) “Cottage food business” means a business that:

22 (1) Produces or packages cottage food products in a residential kitchen;

(2) Sells the cottage food products in accordance with § 21-330.1 of this subtitle and regulations adopted by the Department; and

3 (3) Has annual revenues from the sale of cottage food products in an
4 amount not exceeding \$25,000.

5 (b-2) "Cottage food product" means a nonhazardous food, as specified in regulations
6 adopted by the Department, that is sold in the State [directly] **IN ACCORDANCE WITH §**
7 **21-330.1 OF THIS SUBTITLE AND REGULATIONS ADOPTED BY THE DEPARTMENT:**

(2) TO A RETAIL FOOD STORE, INCLUDING A GROCERY STORE, OR A
FOOD COOPERATIVE.

13 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
14 October 1, 2019.
