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## CHAPTER \_\_\_\_\_

1 AN ACT concerning

2 **Education – School Safety Subcabinet Advisory Board – Membership**

3 FOR the purpose of altering the membership of the School Safety Subcabinet Advisory  
4 Board; and generally relating to the School Safety Subcabinet Advisory Board.

5 BY repealing and reenacting, with amendments,

6 Article – Education

7 Section 7–1504

8 Annotated Code of Maryland

9 (2018 Replacement Volume and 2018 Supplement)

10 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,  
11 That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

12 **Article – Education**

13 7–1504.

14 (a) There is a School Safety Subcabinet Advisory Board.

15 (b) The Advisory Board shall include the following members:

16 (1) One member of the Senate of Maryland, appointed by the President of  
17 the Senate;

- 1                   (2)     One member of the House of Delegates, appointed by the Speaker of the  
2 House;
- 3                   (3)     A representative of local superintendents of schools, appointed by the  
4 Public School Superintendents' Association of Maryland;
- 5                   (4)     A representative of the Maryland Association of Boards of Education,  
6 appointed by the Association;
- 7                   (5)     A school psychologist or licensed or clinical social worker, appointed by  
8 the State Superintendent;
- 9                   (6)     A special education administrator, appointed by the State  
10 Superintendent;
- 11                  (7)     A classroom teacher, appointed jointly by the Maryland State  
12 Education Association and the Baltimore Teachers Union;
- 13                  (8)     A school principal, appointed by the State Superintendent;
- 14                  (9)     One representative of the Department of Human Services, appointed  
15 by the Secretary of Human Services;
- 16                  (10)    One representative of the Department of Juvenile Services, appointed  
17 by the Secretary of Juvenile Services;
- 18                  (11)    A school resource officer, appointed by the Maryland Association of  
19 School Resource Officers;
- 20                  (12)    A sheriff, appointed by the Maryland Sheriffs' Association;
- 21                  (13)    A chief of police, appointed by the Maryland Chiefs of Police  
22 Association, Inc.;
- 23                  (14)    An emergency medical, fire, or rescue services professional, appointed  
24 by the Maryland Institute for Emergency Medical Services Systems;
- 25                  (15)    The Director of the Maryland Coordination and Analysis Center, or the  
26 Director's designee;
- 27                  (16)    One representative of the Maryland Assembly on School-Based Health  
28 Care, appointed by the Assembly;
- 29                  (17)    One representative of the Maryland Association of Student Councils,  
30 appointed by the Association;

1 (18) One representative of the Center for School Mental Health at the  
2 University of Maryland, Baltimore Campus, appointed by the Center for School Mental  
3 Health;

4 (19) One representative of Disability Rights Maryland, appointed by  
5 Disability Rights Maryland; and

6 (20) The following [four] FIVE members of the public, appointed by the  
7 Governor:

8 (i) A parent of a public school student in the State;

9 (ii) A parent of a child with disabilities who attends a school in the  
10 State;

11 (iii) A representative of a nonpublic school in the State; [and]

12 (iv) A representative of school bus drivers; AND

13 (v) **A REPRESENTATIVE OF A NONPUBLIC SPECIAL EDUCATION**  
14 **SCHOOL.**

15 (c) The Governor shall appoint a chair of the Advisory Board from among its  
16 members.

17 (d) A member appointed by the Governor:

18 (1) Serves at the pleasure of the Governor;

19 (2) Serves for a term of 3 years and until a successor is appointed and  
20 qualifies; and

21 (3) May be reappointed but may not serve more than two consecutive  
22 terms.

23 (e) A member of the Advisory Board:

24 (1) May not receive compensation as a member of the Advisory Board; but

25 (2) Is entitled to reimbursement for expenses under the Standard State  
26 Travel Regulations, as provided in the State budget.

27 (f) The Advisory Board shall meet regularly at such times and places as it  
28 determines.

29 (g) The Advisory Board shall provide the Subcabinet with advice and assist the  
30 Subcabinet in completing its duties.

1 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect July  
2 1, 2019.
