1 AN ACT concerning

2 **Somerset County – Alcoholic Beverages – Liquor Control Board Reserve Fund**

3 FOR the purpose of increasing the Somerset County Liquor Control Board reserve fund;
4 increasing the maximum amount of money the Liquor Control Board may distribute
5 from the reserve fund to a dispensary; and generally relating to alcoholic beverages
6 in Somerset County.

18 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,

19 That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

20 **Article – Alcoholic Beverages**

2 This title applies only in Somerset County.

3 29-310.

4 (a) The Liquor Control Board shall apply proceeds derived from the operation of
5 dispensaries first toward the repayment of money advanced to or borrowed by the Liquor
6 Control Board.

7 (b) (1) After repayment under subsection (a) of this section, the Liquor Control
8 Board may maintain a reserve fund not exceeding [~~\$150,000~~] **\$300,000** to:

9 (i) provide adequate working capital; and

10 (ii) cover any losses sustained by the Liquor Control Board in
11 operating the dispensaries.

12 (2) The Liquor Control Board may distribute up to [~~\$50,000~~] **\$100,000**
13 from the reserve fund to each dispensary.

14 (c) Of the proceeds generated by the dispensaries in excess of the amount
15 required to maintain the reserve fund, the Liquor Control Board annually shall distribute:

16 (1) by May 1, to the county:

17 (i) 75% of the remaining proceeds generated by the dispensaries in
18 Crisfield and the West Princess Anne election districts; and

19 (ii) all of the remaining proceeds generated by the dispensary in the
20 Dublin election district; and

21 (2) by June 1, to the City of Crisfield and the Town of Princess Anne, in
22 equal amounts, 25% of the remaining proceeds generated by the dispensaries in Crisfield
23 and the West Princess Anne election districts.

24 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect July
25 1, 2019.
