SUCH AS BY USING RADAR SPEED DISPLAY SIGNS IN AREAS WHERE PEDESTRIAN CRASHES HAVE OCCURRED.
(G) (1) THE TREASURER SHALL INVEST THE MONEY OF THE FUND IN THE SAME MANNER AS OTHER STATE MONEY MAY BE INVESTED.
(2) ANY INVESTMENT EARNINGS OF THE FUND SHALL BE CREDITED TO THE FUND.
