3 FOR the purpose of establishing the Mel Noland Fellowship Program in the Department of 4 Natural Resources; establishing the purpose of the Fellowship Program; requiring $\mathbf{5}$ the Department to develop criteria for the selection of fellows and receiving 6 managing organizations; requiring the Department to select a certain managing 7 organization; requiring the Department and managing organization to select a 8 certain number of fellows and place them in receiving organizations working in 9 certain areas support them in their matriculation in certain fields of study at an institution of higher education; authorizing the Department or managing 10 organization to require a fellow to complete certain tasks; requiring a fellow to 11 12receive a certain stipend in addition to a certain salary; providing for the use of 13 certain funds; renaming a certain special fund to be the Mel Noland Woodland 14Incentives and Fellowship Fund; expanding the authorized uses of the Fund to 15include funding the Fellowship Program; expanding the sources of the Fund;
