A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

2 Board of Public Works – Exchange of State Real Property – Limitation

- FOR the purpose of prohibiting real property of the State or a unit of the State government
 from being exchanged to the United States if the purpose of the exchange is to
 acquire control of federal land on which a professional football stadium will be built;
 making a conforming change; making this Act an emergency measure; and generally

17 (a) (1) [Subject] EXCEPT AS PROVIDED IN PARAGRAPH (2) OF THIS 18 SUBSECTION AND SUBJECT to subsection (b) of this section, any real or personal property 19 of the State or a unit of the State government may be sold, leased, transferred, exchanged, 20 granted, or otherwise disposed of:

- 21 [(1)] (I) to any person, to the United States or any of its units, or to any 22 unit of the State government, for a consideration the Board decides is adequate; or
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- [(2)] (II) to any county or municipal corporation in the State subject to any

2 (2) REAL PROPERTY OF THE STATE OR A UNIT OF THE STATE 3 GOVERNMENT MAY NOT BE EXCHANGED TO THE UNITED STATES IF THE PURPOSE 4 OF THE EXCHANGE IS TO ACQUIRE CONTROL OF FEDERAL LAND ON WHICH A 5 PROFESSIONAL FOOTBALL STADIUM WILL BE BUILT.

6 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act is an emergency 7 measure, is necessary for the immediate preservation of the public health or safety, has 8 been passed by a yea and nay vote supported by three-fifths of all the members elected to 9 each of the two Houses of the General Assembly, and shall take effect from the date it is 10 enacted.
