A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

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Correctional Services - Elderly Inmates - Compassionate Release

3 FOR the purpose of establishing compassionate release as a form of release from 4 incarceration for inmates over a certain age under certain circumstances; 5 establishing a means of initiating consideration by the Maryland Parole Commission 6 of the appropriateness of granting compassionate release; requiring the Commission 7 to provide for a compassionate release hearing on receipt of a certain request; 8 requiring the Commission to appoint a certain guardian to represent the best 9 interests of a certain person under certain circumstances; authorizing the Commission to grant compassionate release on a certain finding; requiring the 10 11 Commission to impose certain conditions in conjunction with compassionate release: 12 authorizing the Commission to impose certain conditions in conjunction with 13 compassionate release; authorizing a certain person who is denied compassionate 14 release by the Commission to request an additional compassionate release hearing 15 at a certain time; providing that a certain person who is denied compassionate 16 release by the Commission may not be housed with the general population in a 17 correctional facility, shall be housed in a separate area of a correctional facility 18 reserved exclusively for the elderly, and shall be provided with certain services that specifically address the needs of the elderly; providing for the applicability to 19 20 compassionate release proceedings of provisions of law concerning victim notification and participation in parole proceedings; requiring the Commission to adopt certain 21 22 regulations; and generally relating to elderly inmates.

- 3 (1) SHALL INCLUDE AS A CONDITION OF RELEASE THE REQUIREMENT
- 4 FOR AN INDIVIDUALIZED ASSESSMENT OF THE INMATE'S NEED FOR CONTINUED
- 5 HEALTH TREATMENT AND SUPPORT SERVICES, INCLUDING RESIDENTIAL
- 6 PLACEMENT IF CONSISTENT WITH THE ASSESSMENT;
- 7 (2) SHALL PROVIDE FOR THE ENROLLMENT OF THE INMATE IN THE
- 8 APPROPRIATE MEDICAL PROGRAM, INCLUDING MEDICARE OR MEDICAID, BEFORE
- 9 RELEASE; AND
- 10 (3) MAY PROVIDE FOR ANY OTHER CONDITION OF SUPERVISION OR
- $11 \quad {\bf TREATMENT\ DETERMINED\ NECESSARY\ OR\ APPROPRIATE.}$
- 12 (F) IF THE COMMISSION DENIES COMPASSIONATE RELEASE TO AN INMATE
- 13 UNDER THIS SECTION, THE INMATE:
- 14 (1) MAY REQUEST AN ADDITIONAL COMPASSIONATE RELEASE
- 15 HEARING 1 YEAR AFTER THE DENIAL;
- 16 (2) MAY NOT BE HOUSED WITH THE GENERAL POPULATION IN A
- 17 CORRECTIONAL FACILITY;
- 18 (3) SHALL BE HOUSED IN A SEPARATE AREA OF A CORRECTIONAL
- 19 FACILITY RESERVED EXCLUSIVELY FOR THE ELDERLY; AND
- 20 (4) SHALL BE PROVIDED WITH COST-EFFECTIVE SERVICES THAT
- 21 SPECIFICALLY ADDRESS THE NEEDS OF THE ELDERLY.
