## A BILL ENTITLED

## 2 Hospitals – Emergency Departments – Identification, Treatment, and Rescue of 3 Human Trafficking Victims

- FOR the purpose of requiring certain hospitals to have a certain protocol and a certain forensic nurse examiner on staff who is present at all times in the hospital's emergency department to identify, treat, and rescue victims of human trafficking who arrive at the emergency department for treatment, to the extent practicable; making a certain stylistic change; and generally relating to hospital emergency departments identifying, treating, and rescuing victims of human trafficking.

- 15 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND.

## 17 Article - Health - General

- (A) [On or before July 1, 2014, each] EACH hospital that provides emergency medical services shall have a protocol to provide timely access to a sexual assault medical forensic examination by a forensic nurse examiner or a physician to a victim of an alleged rape [or], sexual offense, OR HUMAN TRAFFICKING who arrives at the hospital for

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(B) TO THE EXTENT PRACTICABLE, EACH HOSPITAL THAT PROVIDES

- 1 EMERGENCY MEDICAL SERVICES SHALL HAVE A TRAINED FORENSIC NURSE
- 2 EXAMINER ON STAFF WHO IS PRESENT AT ALL TIMES IN THE HOSPITAL'S
- 3 EMERGENCY DEPARTMENT TO IDENTIFY, TREAT, AND RESCUE HUMAN TRAFFICKING
- 4 VICTIMS WHO ARRIVE AT THE EMERGENCY DEPARTMENT FOR TREATMENT.
- 5 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
- 6 October 1, 2019.
