 (Firefighter Jesse McCollough's McCullough's Cancer Protection Law)
- FOR the purpose of altering the circumstances under which certain firefighters, fire
 fighting instructors, rescue squad members, advanced life support unit members,
 and sworn members of the Office of the State Fire Marshal are presumed to be
 suffering from an occupational disease that was suffered in the line of duty and is
 compensable under the workers' compensation law; making stylistic changes;
 providing for the application of this Act; and generally relating to the occupational
 disease presumptions under the workers' compensation law.

- 17 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,

3 4 5 6 7 8 9	(c) A paid firefighter, paid fire fighting instructor, paid rescue squad member, paid advanced life support unit member, or a sworn member of the Office of the State Fire Marshal employed by an airport authority, a county, a fire control district, a municipality, or the State or a volunteer firefighter, volunteer fire fighting instructor, volunteer rescue squad member, or volunteer advanced life support unit member who is a covered employee under § 9–234 of this title is presumed to be suffering from an occupational disease that was suffered in the line of duty and is compensable under this title if the individual:
10	(1) <u>THE INDIVIDUAL</u> has leukemia or prostate, rectal, throat, multiple

13 (2) <u>THE INDIVIDUAL</u> has completed at least 10 years of CUMULATIVE 14 service <u>WITHIN THE STATE</u> as a firefighter, A fire fighting instructor, A rescue squad 15 member, or AN advanced life support unit member or in a combination of those jobs [in the 16 department where the individual currently is employed or serves]; AND

 20 disability; and] <u>THE CANCER OR LEUKEMIA RESULTS IN PARTIAL OR TOTAL</u>
 21 DISABILITY OR DEATH; AND

22 f(4) in the case of a volunteer firefighter, volunteer fire fighting 23 instructor, volunteer rescue squad member, or volunteer advanced life support unit 24 member, <u>THE INDIVIDUAL</u> has met a suitable standard of physical examination before 25 becoming a firefighter, fire fighting instructor, rescue squad member, or advanced life 26 support unit member.

27 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall be construed to 28 apply only prospectively and may not be applied or interpreted to have any effect on or 29 application to any claim filed before the effective date of this Act.

30 SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 31 October 1, 2019.
