30 (a) Title to property may not pass to an assignee for the benefit of creditors until 31 the assignee files a bond as required by the Maryland Rules. If the assignee makes a sale 32 before filing a bond, the sale is not valid and does not pass title to the property sold.

33 (b) If all other legal requirements were met, a conveyance made by an assignee 34 for the benefit of creditors when two sureties on the bond were required is valid even though 35 a bond was given with only one surety.
