FOR the purpose of requiring a custodian of the personnel record of a law enforcement agency on a law enforcement officer to allow inspection of the record by a representative of a certain investigative agency; and generally relating to the inspection of personnel records of law enforcement officers.

13 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, 14 That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

Article – General Provisions

17 (a) Subject to subsection (b) of this section, a custodian shall deny inspection of a 18 personnel record of an individual, including an application, a performance rating, or 19 scholastic achievement information.

- 20 (b) A custodian shall allow inspection by:
- 21 (1) the person in interest;

1 (2) an elected or appointed official who supervises the work of the 2 individual; [or]

3 (3) IF THE PERSONNEL RECORD IS THE RECORD OF A LAW 4 ENFORCEMENT AGENCY ON A LAW ENFORCEMENT OFFICER, A REPRESENTATIVE OF 5 AN AGENCY WITH THE POWER AND JURISDICTION TO ADMINISTRATIVELY 6 INVESTIGATE ALLEGED MISCONDUCT OF THE LAW ENFORCEMENT OFFICER WHO IS 7 THE SUBJECT OF THE RECORD; OR

- 8 [(3)] (4) an employee organization described in Title 6 of the Education 9 Article of the portion of the personnel record that contains the individual's:
- 10 (i) home address;
- 11 (ii) home telephone number; and
- 12 (iii) personal cell phone number.

13 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect14 October 1, 2019.
