### 1 AN ACT concerning

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## Kent County Alcoholic Beverages Act of 2019

- 3 FOR the purpose of authorizing a holder of a Class D beer, wine, and liquor license in Kent 4 County to sell alcoholic beverages for off-premises consumption as well as  $\mathbf{5}$ on-premises consumption; repealing a certain provision of law concerning Sunday 6 sales under a Class D license; increasing the maximum number of rooms that a 7 facility with a Class B (country inn) beer, wine, and liquor license may offer to the 8 public as sleeping accommodations; decreasing the minimum number of 9 permanently installed seats required in a theater with a theater beer, wine, and 10 liquor license; authorizing a licensed theater to regularly present cinematic as well 11 as live entertainment; altering the hours of sale for a licensed theater; and generally 12relating to alcoholic beverages licenses in Kent County.

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$\frac{1}{2}$	SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:
3	Article – Alcoholic Beverages

5	This title applies only in Kent County.

7	(a) There is a Class D beer, wine, and liquor license.
8 9 10	(b) The license authorizes the license holder to sell beer, wine, and liquor at retail at the place described in the license for [on-premises] ON- AND OFF-PREMISES consumption.
$\frac{11}{12}$	(c) [On Sunday, a license holder may sell only beer and wine for off-premises consumption.
13	(d)] The license may not be issued for use by a drugstore.
14	[(e)] (D) The annual license fee is \$1,500.

16	(a) There is a Class B (country inn) beer, wine, and liquor license.
$17\\18$	(b) The Board may issue the Class B (country inn) beer, wine, and liquor license for the use of a country inn that:
19	(1) is licensed by the county to operate as a country inn;
$20 \\ 21 \\ 22$	<ul><li>(2) excluding the resident management quarters, has not more than [10]</li><li>15 rooms that the public for consideration may use for sleeping accommodations for a specified time; and</li></ul>
$\frac{23}{24}$	(3) has a kitchen facility for the guests that is separate from the kitchen facility for the resident management quarters.
25 $26$	(c) The license authorizes the license holder to sell beer, wine, and liquor for on-premises consumption to a guest if:
27 $28$	(1) the name and address of the guest appear on the registry that the country inn maintains; and

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(2)1 the guest is an occupant of a sleeping room in the country inn.  $\mathbf{2}$ (d) The license holder may sell beer, wine, and liquor during the hours and days 3 as set out for a Class B beer, wine, and liquor license under § 24–2004 of this title. 4 (e)The license does not authorize the sale of beer, wine, and liquor to an  $\mathbf{5}$ individual who is registered as a guest at the country inn only to obtain beer, wine, and liquor. 6 7 (f) If the country inn ceases to be operated as a country inn, the license is void. 8 The annual license fee is \$550. (g) 9 24 - 1004.10 There is a theater beer, wine, and liquor license. (a) The Board may issue the license to an applicant for the use of a theater that: 11 (b) 12(1)is housed in a building; 13 (2)has a capacity to hold at least [150] **100** permanently installed seats; 14and 15(3)regularly presents live **OR CINEMATIC** entertainment. 16 The license authorizes the license holder to sell beer, wine, and liquor at retail (c)17for on-premises consumption. [The] EXCEPT FROM 2 A.M. TO 6 A.M., THE license holder may sell beer, 18 (d) 19 wine, and liquor [: 20(1)for 2 hours before the entertainment begins; 21(2)during the entertainment; and 22for 1 hour after the entertainment ends] WHEN THE THEATER IS (3)23OPEN TO THE PUBLIC. 24The license may not be transferred to another location. (e) 25(f) The annual license fee is \$500. 26SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect July

27 1, 2019.

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
