relating to county boards of education and equal access to public services for
individuals with limited English proficiency.

5	(2) (i) the translation of vital documents ordinarily provided to the
6	public into any language spoken by any limited English proficient population that
7	constitutes 3% of the overall population within the geographic area served by a local office
8	of a State program OR A COUNTY BOARD, AS DEFINED IN § 1-101 OF THE EDUCATION
9	ARTICLE, as measured by the United States Census; and
10	(ii) the provision of vital documents translated under item (i) of this
11	item on a statewide basis to any local office OR A COUNTY BOARD, AS DEFINED IN §
12	1-101 OF THE EDUCATION ARTICLE, as necessary; and
13	(3) any additional methods or means necessary to achieve equal access to
14	public services.

15 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect July1, 2019.
