1 AN ACT concerning

Maryland Department of Health – Special Supplemental Nutrition Program for Women, Infants, and Children – Reports

FOR the purpose of requiring the Maryland Department of Health, in consultation with
certain stakeholders, to report certain information regarding the Special
Supplemental Nutrition Program for Women, Infants, and Children to certain
committees of the General Assembly on or before a certain date each year; requiring
the Department, in producing the report, to consult with certain stakeholders;
providing for the termination of this Act; and generally relating to the Special
Supplemental Nutrition Program for Women, Infants, and Children.

SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,
 That:

13 On or before December 1, 2019, and each year thereafter, the Maryland (a) Department of Health, after consultation with the Maryland Alliance for the Poor, local 14 health departments, MedChi, the Maryland State Medical Society, and other interested 1516 stakeholders, shall submit a report on the Special Supplemental Nutrition Program for Women, Infants, and Children (WIC) to the Senate Budget and Taxation Committee, the 1718 Senate Finance Committee, the House Appropriations Committee, and the House Health and Government Operations Committee, in accordance with § 2-1246 of the State 19Government Article. 20
