A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

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Occupational Licenses or Certificates – Application Determinations – Use of Criminal History

4 FOR the purpose of prohibiting certain departments or local licensing authorities that issue 5 occupational licenses or certificates from denying an application for a license or 6 certificate based on an applicant's criminal history if a certain period of time has 7 passed since the applicant's conviction for a nonviolent crime unless the department 8 or local licensing authority makes a certain determination; repealing a certain 9 provision of law that requires a certain department to consider certain information 10 in making application determinations for occupational licenses or certificates; 11 authorizing an individual to petition a department or local licensing authority to 12 make a determination as to whether the individual's prior conviction will disqualify 13 the individual from an occupational license or certificate; requiring a department or 14 local licensing authority to include in certain applications a list of specific criminal 15 convictions that would disqualify an applicant; defining a certain term; establishing 16 that a certain provision of law relating to a prohibition on certain departments or 17 licensing authorities considering certain applicants' criminal history does not apply 18 to individuals who are on parole or probation or the subject of criminal charges; and 19 generally relating to the use of criminal history in determinations on applications for 20 occupational licenses or certificates.

- 6 1. THE SPECIFIC DUTIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES 7 REQUIRED OF A LICENSEE OR CERTIFICATE HOLDER; AND
- 2. WHETHER THE APPLICANT'S PREVIOUS CONVICTION
 9 HAS ANY IMPACT ON THE APPLICANT'S FITNESS OR ABILITY TO PERFORM THE
 10 DUTIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES AUTHORIZED BY THE LICENSE OR CERTIFICATE; or
- [(2)] (II) the issuance of the license or certificate would involve an unreasonable risk to property or to the safety or welfare of specific individuals or the general public.
- [(e) In making the determination under subsection (d) of this section, the department shall consider:
- 16 (1) the policy of the State expressed in subsection (c) of this section;
- 17 (2) the specific duties and responsibilities required of a licensee or 18 certificate holder;
- 19 (3) whether the applicant's previous conviction has any impact on the 20 applicant's fitness or ability to perform the duties and responsibilities authorized by the 21 license or certificate:
- 22 (4) the age of the applicant at the time of the conviction and the amount of 23 time that has elapsed since the conviction;
- 24 (5) the seriousness of the offense for which the applicant was convicted;
- other information provided by the applicant or on the applicant's behalf with regard to the applicant's rehabilitation and good conduct; and
- 27 (7) the legitimate interest of the department in protecting property and the safety and welfare of specific individuals or the general public.]
- (D) AT ANY TIME AN INDIVIDUAL MAY PETITION THE APPROPRIATE 30 DEPARTMENT OR LOCAL LICENSING AUTHORITY TO MAKE A DETERMINATION AS TO 31 WHETHER THE INDIVIDUAL'S PRIOR CONVICTION WOULD DISQUALIFY THE 32 INDIVIDUAL FROM AN OCCUPATIONAL LICENSE OR CERTIFICATION.

- 1 (E) A DEPARTMENT OR LOCAL LICENSING AUTHORITY, ON ANY
 2 APPLICATION FOR AN OCCUPATIONAL LICENSE OR CERTIFICATE ISSUED BY THE
