# Education - Opening Public Schools Before Labor Day - Public Local Laws and Referendum

- 4 FOR the purpose of authorizing the governing body of a county to adopt, subject to a certain  $\mathbf{5}$ provision of law, a public local law to exempt the public schools in the county from 6 the requirements of a certain executive order; requiring a certain governing body of 7 a county to submit to the voters a certain public local law at a certain election before 8 it becomes effective; requiring a certain question on the ballot to include certain 9 words; providing that submission of a certain question or similar question does not 10 prevent the submission of the same or another question at a subsequent election; 11 providing that a certain public local law becomes effective under certain 12circumstances and is null and void under certain circumstances; authorizing a 13 county board to set certain dates for the school year for certain schools under certain circumstances; providing that certain powers of certain local governments are 14 intended and deemed to include certain power and authority; defining a certain term; 1516making this Act an emergency measure; and generally relating to opening public 17schools before Labor Day.

### The Charter of Baltimore City

19 Article II – General Powers

The Mayor and City Council of Baltimore shall have full power and authority to exercise all of the powers heretofore or hereafter granted to it by the Constitution of Maryland or by any Public General or Public Local Laws of the State of Maryland; and in particular, without limitation upon the foregoing, shall have power by ordinance, or such other method as may be provided for in its Charter, subject to the provisions of said Constitution and Public General Laws:

(A) Subject to the applicable provisions of the Education Article of the Annotated
 Code of Maryland, to establish and maintain a system of free public schools.

(B) TO EXERCISE THE AUTHORITY UNDER § 7–125 OF THE EDUCATION
ARTICLE OF THE ANNOTATED CODE OF MARYLAND TO ENABLE PUBLIC SCHOOLS
TO OPEN FOR STUDENT ATTENDANCE BEFORE THE TUESDAY IMMEDIATELY
FOLLOWING LABOR DAY AND TO ADJOURN ON A DATE AFTER JUNE 15.
