10. Description and Purpose of Organization (Limit length to visible area)							

Anne Arundel County is a local jurisdiction in the State of Maryland serving over 500,000 residents. Andover Park is a community park in Linthicum, MD owned by Anne Arundel County, providing paved trail access to the BWI trail, a football field used by Andover Apache Youth Sports Organization, and six baseball fields used by multi-purposely by Linthicum Ferndale Youth Athletic Association (LFYAA). LFYAA is a 501(c)(3) local sports organization in northern Anne Arundel County serving over 3,000 youths, offering baseball, softball, soccer, basketball, and cricket programs for children ages 3-18. The purpose of our organization is to instill in our youth the ideals of fair play, honesty, loyalty, courage, discipline, and good sportsmanship to promote finer, stronger, healthier, happier youths, and develop into law-abiding, productive and civic-minded citizens.

11. Description and Purpose of Project (Limit length to visible area)

This project is to install field lighting on two existing baseball field and address outdated and insufficient lighting on one existing baseball field. The project will address the growth of the Linthicum and Ferndale communities along with the surrounding area. These lighting systems will double the evening capacity of the fields, avoiding the acquisition of land, and the construction of new fields. This additional field capacity will help Linthicum Ferndale Youth Athletic Association as we strive to accommodate the growing number of youth sports participants, and avoid turning children away. We will install state of the art lights that minimize spill and glare. The support of the Maryland General Assembly will be greatly appreciated.

28. Comments

Our association draws mainly from Lindale Middle School feeder system. In July 2018, Anne Arundel County Public Schools Planning Office released an Educational Master Facilities Plan outlining present and projected FTE enrollment for county schools. Within the next 10 years, 5 major housing projects have been announced for the Linthicum area, the largest of which is programmed for 2,790 housing units. As a result, Lindale Middle is expected to grow by over 50% and Linthicum Elementary is expected to grow over 70% (currently 491 students to an estimated 840 students by 2027). This growth projection has Linthicum Elementary as the largest growing elementary school in the county over the next 10 years. I am asking for your support so we can continue to serve our community in this time of growth.
