Somerset County is located amidst the splendors of Marylands Eastern Shore, an area between the Chesapeake Bay and the Atlantic, renowned for its natural charm. This gracious, less frenetic part of the world, combines tradition and simplicity of life with the beauty of the untouched countryside. History is ever present and every sunset is a celebration. For nearly three centuries the area now called "Crisfield" has been famous for its seafood - especially its Blue Crab and Oysters, its watermen, its natural beauty and its sense of community built on a common faith and deep roots. It's a waterfront hamlet with a "home town" feel and a Mecca for travelers anxious to experience water recreation, ecological wonders and friendly people and some of the best seafood in the country.

11. Description and Purpose of Project (Limit length to visible area)

Somerset County and the City of Crisfield own and operate the Crisfield -Somerset County Airport (W41). In order to promote economic growth in the region as well as use of this critical facility, an airport hangar is needed. The grant will be used for design, construction and project management of an eight unit hangar as shown on the approved Airport Layout Plan (copy attached). The project scope includes permitting, site work, utilities, preengineered hangar, interior office and restroom. Permitting involves critical areas, floodplain, stormwater management, sediment control, FAA use, grading, electric, plumbing and building (maps attached). Utilities include electric, telephone, cable, water and sewer. This project is supported by the Board of County Commissioners, Mayor/Council of the City of Crisfield, Somerset County Economic Development Commission, the University of Maryland-Eastern Shore and Navmar Applied Science Corporation (letters attached).

28. Comments

It is important to note that FAA funding of public airports like the Crisfield-Somerset County Airport is dependent upon the number of aircraft based at the airport. The goal of constructing this eight unit hangar is to encourage users to base their operations from this airport. Considering that the normal funding match for airport related projects is 90% FAA, 5% MAA and 5% Local (2.5% City & 2.5% County), it is imperative that the number of aircraft be increased to this minimum threshold.

Quite often the City and County find businesses interested in relocating to the area which note the importance of air transportation. This involves not only delivery of products but executive personnel as well. Considering our proximity to the Patuxent Naval Base, there has been some interest in using our airport and less restrictive airspace. There has also been interest in relocating aircraft from the University of Maryland Eastern Shore's Aviation Program to our airport. Having the necessary amenities will strongly encourage businesses to consider relocating to this economically challenged region.
