The project is for improvements to our campus which will help us to increase our capacity and upgrade our instruction capabilities, to include the following: Construction of a log cabin adjacent to our Native American site for teaching colonial history; an aquaponics system demonstration; a geothermal heating system to heat and cool our dormitories and dining hall; a yurt to add five bedrooms to our staff housing; improvements to our historic fleet of workboats, specifically renovation of the laboratory boat, "Twilight", and a new engine for a second laboratory boat, "Spirit"; improvements to staff housing including roofing and crawl space encapsulation; an orchard and colonial garden; living shoreline and stormwater management.
