10. Description and Purpose of Organiza							

Gardens for Heroes is a 501C-3 organization dedicated to addressing the challenges faced by our veterans here in Anne Arundel County. This includes: Suicide, Depression, Chronic Pain, Addiction, Post Traumatic Stress Disorder, Amputation, Traumatic Brain Injury, reintegrating into family and society. GFH's gardens are evidence based designed to aid in the recovery of these conditions The gardens offer, blended therapies, intentionally designed physical challenges, cognitive and emotional support, sensory stimulation, and community cohesion. The gardens are proven to be effective by research conducted by NIH, Walter Reed National Military Medical Center, Uniformed Services University and the American Horticulture Therapy Association.

11. Description and Purpose of Project (Limit length to visible area)

Gardens for Heroes is requesting \$250,000 to design and build our research supported therapeutic garden to serve wounded veterans, their loved ones and caregivers in Maryland. Meditative, edible, and agility garden design will be featured within the therapeutic garden. The garden will be built at Homestead Gardens in Davidsonville, Maryland and serve as the model for replication at other Maryland locations. The therapeutic garden will be the first to demonstrate the full hospital to home model. The garden will include the 3 pillars of our model: 1) healthcare garden design with physical challenges 2) community garden design for reintegration, and 3) small-scale residential healing garden design with raised table beds and miniature gardens. We project to serve over 25,000 veterans and their family members annually. In addition, 350,000 people visit Homestead Gardens each year and we estimate 75,000 people visiting the garden to interact with our veterans.

In addition, 350,000 people visit Homestead Gardens annually. Of that number, we estimate 75,000 people visiting the garden and interacting with our veterans.
