10. Description and Purpose of Organization (Limit length to visible area)							

The Ivymount School, Inc. established in 1961, is a nonpublic special education facility, located in Rockville MD, & approved under COMAR 13A.09.10. As a nonpublic special education facility, Ivymount School, currently serving over 200 students w/developmental disabilities including autism spectrum disorders and other related disabilities, receives publicly funded tuition payments, under Education Articles 8-406 and 8-415. Since inception, Ivymount has consistently focused on meeting the needs of those students for whom limited educational & therapeutic options exist. The complexity of needs require programs that are modeled on the integration of safe & appropriate facilities, therapeutic services, differentiated

educational instruction, and provision of tools and strategies that prepare students for independent & productive futures. (continued #28)

11. Description and Purpose of Project (Limit length to visible area)

In accordance with the Maryland Safe to Learn Act of 2018, Ivymount School had the security assessment completed in July 2018. The results documented the following security recommendations: Replace/Upgrade Access Control System previously installed in 2001;install electronic Visitor Control System;expand the CCTV camera system and devices to include additional interior cameras and install exterior cameras; reconfigure Front Office area for increased security sight lines; reinforce glass entrance doors with bullet/impact resistant film;removal of current landscaping that offer concealment, and replanting against property line; electronic accountability system for students and staff for use during emergency situations and drills Under the Maryland Safe to Learn Act of 2018, funding for security upgrades for Ivymount School, and all nonpublic special education schools, was inadvertently excluded from the Act. 10. Program Description Continued:

In 2004, Ivymount School, Inc., create The Maddux School. The Maddux School is an early intervention regular education program providing small, structured classes with specialized social & language supports for young children in pre-kindergarten-second grade. Through individualized & differentiated instruction, Maddux School maintains high academic standards while addressing social challenges, learning differences and self-esteem concerns. On average, Ivymount School and the Maddux School serve 250 students annually Ivymount Outreach Programs, established in 2004, offers services by highly trained staff to individuals, families and professionals. Our services include recreational, educational, and therapeutic programs, as well as, trainings and consultation across a variety of topics in the field of special education. Services include: High quality ABA services for individuals ages 2 young adult; Individual Educational and Therapeutic Services including Speech Therapy, Occupational Therapy, and Tutoring; Educational and Therapeutic Group Programs for individuals with Autism, ADHD, Executive Function disorders, and other developmental disabilities; Recreational programs are offered after school and on weekends for participants school aged - adult. Programs are staffed by highly trained Ivymount School staff who develop and implement age appropriate activities that are fun, engaging, and memorable. Ivymount Outreach Programs serves several hundred community individuals who are not Ivvmount students

In addition, Ivymount School provides significant community use of space in the following key ways: Ivymount leases space to Montgomery Child Care Association-Beverly Farms; Ivymount is a polling site; Ivymount hosted a 1st Responders round table discussion on assisting individuals with disabilities; Ivymount has coordinated a state wide task force to create a curriculum guide on Emergency Preparedness of Individuals with Disabilities

11. Description of Project Continued:

Under the Maryland Safe to Learn Act of 2018, funding for security upgrades for Ivymount School, and all nonpublic special education schools, was inadvertently excluded from the Act.

Funding for the nonpublic special education schools was excluded from the \$32.5 million dollars awarded to public schools for school safety grants (MSDE), safety related capital and operating grants (IAC), school safety improvement grants (capital budget) and safety assessment grants (MCSS). Funding for the nonpublic special education schools was excluded from the \$3.5 million dollars awarded under the Nonpublic School Safety Capital Improvement Grant since nonpublic special education schools are not eligible for the Nonpublic School Texting Program or the Nonpublic Schools Aging Programs.

FUNDING CHALLENGES:Ivymount School has been restricted from applying for some federal, local and corporate grants simply by virtue of being a nonpublic special education school. We have started the application process with, among other entities, Homeland Security, The National Institute of Justice, Motorola, Mitsubishi, and several foundations which indicate that they fund only public schools and, in some cases, only Title 1 schools.
