10. Description and Purpose of Organization (Limit length to visible area)

Founded in 1993, Mother Seton Academy (MSA) is a tuition-free middle-school located in Baltimore City at 2215 Greenmount Avenue that serves 76 boys and girls, ages 11-14, from urban low-income families of all faiths and cultures. The mission of MSA is to provide young boys and girls who are facing social determinants and limited prospects (through no fault of their own) opportunities for bigger and brighter futures through quality education. Mother Seton Academy's unique model features small classes (14-15 students), rigorous academics, an extended school day and year, and an extensive Graduate Support system. All of these contribute to MSA's success in helping to break the cycle of poverty through education, as seen with the school's 100% graduation rate, 92% student high school graduation rate, and 75% alumni enrollment in college enrollment.

11. Description and Purpose of Project (Limit length to visible area)

MSA is always looking for ways to improve and expand our services. This Bond Bill request focuses on that, with the undertaking of an expansion that would include a gymnasium, community room, and garden. Currently, the students do not have a gymnasium, and most opportunities for exercise and play require walking along heavily trafficked Greenmount Ave. to a nearby park. This gymnasium will provide a safe, clean, controlled indoor space for physical education, sports with other schools, and an area for the children to play in freely. A learning garden and community room are also included. The garden will provide hands-on learning for science classes and a peaceful area for reading and studying. The community room will host music classes during the day and public meetings after school. Last, but not least, the dismissal process will be safer by utilizing the new Boone St. entrance in addition to decreasing traffic and congestion at Greenmount Ave. and E. 22nd St.
