As you can see, with the fields being used regularly, the conditions of the grass fields deteriorate quickly. Due to the deterioration, this does lead to safety concerns for anyone playing on the fields. Equity does play a role in all of this as well. When fields are unsafe, we must cancel outside practice and seek alternative areas. Schools that already have turf do not have these issues, they simply continue to practice/play on their field.
