The Baltimore County Department of Recreation and Parks provides safe and attractive public park space throughout Baltimore County, serving over 800,000 residents. The Department provides comprehensive recreation and parks programs, facilities and services.							

They strive to preserve, enhance and protect our open spaces to enrich the quality of life for

present and future generations in a safe and secure environment.

11. Description and Purpose of Project (Limit length to visible area)

This project, called Radebaugh Neighborhood Park Phase 2, is to complete the development of the park beyond the simple grass surfaces that were provided in Phase 1. The first public park in the residential community of Aigburth Manor in east Towson, the park will provide passive and active open space, as well as safe passage for students from the nearby high school to adjacent neighborhoods. The requested funds will complete the park, including planning, design, and installation of signage, trash cans, bike racks, benches, handicapped access path, play structure for young children, security lighting, and shade trees. In Phase 1, the park property was purchased and extensive industrial materials including old greenhouses were removed. The shaping of the the land is nearly finished. Grass is expected to be established sufficiently for people to enter the property by the end of June 2019.

enrollment. The close proximity of this park to the downtown core will provide important opportunities for exercise, play, and the nurturing of relationships among residents of many communities within walking and bicycling distance.

Proposed park amenities will serve people of all ages and abilities, as they include include play space for young children, an asphalt path for handicapped accessibility, benches for rest and conversation, bike racks, and trees for shade and beauty. The trees and capture of storm runoff will modulate the flow of stormwater into the adjacent Herring Run, a tributary of the Chesapeake Bay.
