Our mission is to promote holistic, strength-based, and faith-based principles within the human service community. Our goal is to therapeutically support and strengthen youth, families, organizations and communities through the creation of innovative health services, products and initiatives. WIN Team currently serves approximately 600 individuals. With plans to introduce five new health programs in 2019, WIN remains committed to serving more youth, families and individuals and a new larger facility is an ideal means of offering the highest level of services.

## **11. Description and Purpose of Project** (Limit length to visible area)

In an effort to meet the needs of Baltimore County and City residents, WIN Team LLC, in partnership with its sister agency WIN Family Services Inc., plans to build a new Maryland headquarters in Baltimore County to provide expanded child welfare and behavioral healthcare services to residents of Baltimore County, Baltimore City and surrounding counties. The WIN health treatment facility project requires a complete build out of a 13,000 square foot facility that will offer areas designated for an Outpatient Mental Health Clinic offering group and individual therapy, youth and adult psychiatric rehabilitation, somatic health services, psychiatric day programming, partial hospitalization and opioid support for individuals with substance use disorders, Family Strengthening training, and administrative offices for more than 150 staff.

## 28. Comments

Maryland is facing an ever increasing opioid and substance use epidemic, coupled with an increased numbers of youth and adults impacted by mental illness. In a recent Community Health Needs Assessment survey, conducted by LifeBridge Health Systems, Maryland residents are greatly impacted by the effects of drug addiction in communities; the assessment noted how it impacts physical health, leading to chronic disease. Stakeholders also noted stigma and silence around mental health, the lack of treatment resources and the disproportionately high availability of liquor stores. Most of the stakeholders in the Northwest service area identified behavioral health as a top priority. Additionally, the Baltimore County Health Department officials noted the presence of opioid crisis in the community and the lack of treatment for mental health disorders.
