<p>WYPR is the premier National Public Radio station in Baltimore. WYPR is a non-commercial, independent, community owned and member supported radio station established in 2002, the only one of Baltimore's four public radio stations that receives no state support because it is unaffiliated with any state university. WYPR offers an essential service to its 250,000 weekly listeners in the Baltimore region and beyond through its streaming and podcast services, which are available worldwide on WYPR.org. WYPR's mission is to inform, connect, and challenge the listeners we serve in the metropolitan Baltimore area and the State of Maryland by broadcasting programs of intellectual integrity and cultural merit so as to provide an unbiased perspective of the events of today and to enrich the minds and spirits of our audience.</p>		

11. Description and Purpose of Project (Limit length to visible area)

State funds would enable WYPR to complete needed renovations to upgrade broadcast studio equipment, to repair the building facade, and to achieve ADA compliance. In addition, repairs to a deteriorating roof and replacement of inefficient windows has become a necessity. The building dates to the early 1960's and is located in the major crossroads of the Old Goucher Neighborhood and Charles Street corridor. These essential upgrades will not only enhance the function of the building, but will also enable WYPR to make technological and structural improvements so WYPR can continue to play its leading role of providing quality journalism and programming. In addition, this funding will enable WYPR to continue to be an anchor in a steadily improving neighborhood.

WYPR provides a daily forum for listeners on programs such as Midday with Tom Hall who invites political and thought leaders, social welfare and religious and city leaders, entrepreneurs and artists to discuss issues that shape the present and future of the city of Baltimore and the broader region.

WYPRs local programs, such as On the Record with Sheilah Kast, Out of the Blocks produced by Aaron Henkin, Life in the Balance produced by Katie Marquette and Future City with Wes Moore, are all programs that regularly engage in civil conversation and discuss topics relevant to our area.

The public value offered here is that of continuing to enrich our listeners lives with unique and interesting content to the diverse cultural demographics of the Baltimore region. Programs like these are always free and accessible to all.

As the only independent, community owned, non profit public radio station, WYPR neither seeks nor receives consistent state support as do the other three public stations in Baltimore that are university owned. WYPR only received state support one time in the past. In 2007, WYPR received state funding to convert to digital broadcasting. Twelve years later, we are requesting \$360,000 to support much needed studio/technical upgrades and building renovations.

WYPR operates from its studios at 2216 N. Charles Street in the heart of the Charles Street corridor in Baltimore City. This essential renovation to upgrade the crumbling facade and become ADA compliant can be seen as an example to other stakeholders in the Old Goucher Neighborhood. We believe this renovation is not only essential for WYPR's operations but for the rapidly improving Charles Street corridor as a whole.

We respectfully submit this application with the best intentions for the city of Baltimore, the neighborhood of Old Goucher, the Charles Street corridor, and the 250,000 people in Maryland who rely upon WYPR for balanced journalism and a public forum for the exchange of ideas and information which in turn builds a stronger community and in turn a stronger democracy.
