<u>AMENDMENTS TO HOUSE BILL 4</u> (First Reading File Bill)

AMENDMENT NO. 1

On page 1, strike line 2 in its entirety and substitute "<u>Regulated Firearms –</u> <u>Straw Purchase – Penalties</u>".

On pages 1 through 5, strike in their entirety the lines beginning with line 3 on page 1 through line 4 on page 5 and substitute:

"FOR the purpose of altering the penalties for knowingly participating in a straw purchase of a regulated firearm for certain persons; prohibiting a court from suspending any part of a certain mandatory minimum sentence; providing that a certain person is not eligible for parole during a certain mandatory minimum sentence; making certain technical corrections; and generally relating to straw purchases of regulated firearms.

<u>BY repealing and reenacting, with amendments,</u> <u>Article – Public Safety</u> <u>Section 5–141</u> <u>Annotated Code of Maryland</u> (2018 Replacement Volume and 2019 Supplement)

<u>SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF</u> <u>MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:</u>

(a) <u>A dealer or other person may not be a knowing participant in a straw</u> <u>purchase of a regulated firearm [to] FOR a minor or [to] FOR a person prohibited by</u> law from possessing a regulated firearm.

(b) (1) <u>A person who violates this section is guilty of a [misdemeanor]</u> <u>FELONY and [on]:</u>

(I) FOR A FIRST conviction, is subject to imprisonment FOR NOT LESS THAN 2 YEARS AND not exceeding 10 years or a fine not exceeding \$25,000 or both; AND

(II) FOR A SECOND OR SUBSEQUENT CONVICTION, IS SUBJECT TO IMPRISONMENT FOR NOT LESS THAN 5 YEARS AND NOT EXCEEDING 10 YEARS OR A FINE NOT EXCEEDING \$25,000 OR BOTH.

(2) <u>THE COURT MAY NOT SUSPEND ANY PART OF THE APPLICABLE</u> <u>MANDATORY MINIMUM SENTENCE OF 2 YEARS OR 5 YEARS.</u>

(3) <u>The person is not eligible for parole during the</u> <u>MANDATORY MINIMUM SENTENCE.</u>

(c) Each violation of this section is a separate crime."
