1 AN ACT concerning

2 **Frederick County – Alcoholic Beverages – Weinberg Center License**

3 FOR the purpose of altering in Frederick County the area in which alcoholic beverages may
4 be consumed in the Weinberg Center for the Arts; and generally relating to alcoholic
5 beverages licenses in Frederick County.

16 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,
17 That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

18 **Article – Alcoholic Beverages**

19 20–102.

1 This title applies only in Frederick County.

2 20–1015.

3 (a) There is a Class C (Weinberg Center) beer, wine, and liquor license.

4 (b) (1) The president and two other officers of the Weinberg Center for the Arts
5 shall sign the application for the license.

6 (2) At least two of the officers shall be residents of the county.

7 (c) The Board may issue the license for use by the nonprofit Weinberg Center for
8 the Arts.

9 (d) (1) The license authorizes the license holder to sell beer, wine, and liquor
10 at retail to a customer on the licensed premises.

11 (2) Beer, wine, and liquor may be consumed [only in the central rotunda or
12 the lobby] **ANYWHERE ON THE LICENSED PREMISES.**

13 (e) The license holder may sell beer, wine, and liquor from 1 hour before to 1 hour
14 after:

15 (1) a performance; or

16 (2) a fund–raiser that benefits the Weinberg Center for the Arts.

17 (f) The annual license fee is \$325.

18 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect July
19 1, 2020.
