1 AN ACT concerning

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
## Land Use and Vehicle Miles Traveled Workgroup

FOR the purpose of establishing the Land Use and Vehicle Miles Traveled Workgroup; 3 4 stating the purpose of the Workgroup; providing for the composition, chair, and staffing of the Workgroup; prohibiting a member of the Workgroup from receiving 5 6 certain compensation, but authorizing the reimbursement of certain expenses; 7 authorizing the Workgroup to establish subcommittees and collaborate with expert 8 witnesses; requiring the Workgroup to review and develop a certain strategy; requiring the Workgroup to report its interim and final findings and 9 10 recommendations to the Governor and the General Assembly on or before certain 11 dates; providing for the termination of this Act; and generally relating to the Land Use and Vehicle Miles Traveled Workgroup. 12

13 Preamble

- WHEREAS, Transportation—related activities are the largest producer of greenhouse gas emissions in the State; now, therefore,
- SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, 17 That:
- 18 (a) There is a Land Use and Vehicle Miles Traveled Workgroup.
- 19 (b) The purpose of the Workgroup is to develop a State strategy that identifies 20 State and local land use policies, business incentives, and transportation policies, 21 investments, and programs to:
- 22 (1) reduce vehicle miles traveled in the State;
  - (2) identify any barriers to improving transit-oriented development or

local street grids, parking policy and pricing, and availability of transit in reducing vehicle 1 2miles traveled: 3 (6)existing State and local initiatives that impact vehicle miles traveled; and 4 5 (7)new methods for measuring access to jobs and services, and methods 6 for using these measures to inform State, regional, and local transportation policy and 7 investment decisions. 8 (i) The Workgroup shall develop a State strategy to reduce vehicle miles traveled 9 that: 10 (1) accounts for vehicle miles traveled by new land uses; 11 (2) identifies land use initiatives that: 12(i) increase proximity between jobs, housing, and services; 13 (ii) improve access to existing and planned public transit; and reduce vehicle miles traveled; 14 (iii) addresses equity by reducing combined housing and transportation 15 (3)16 costs, and increasing proximity to jobs and services for lower income populations; and 17 **(4)** ensures that long-term costs to provide government services to existing 18 and new land uses are supported by tax revenues and other benefits of that land use, such 19 as job creation and affordable housing. 20 (j) (1)On or before December 15, 2020, the Workgroup shall report its interim 21findings and recommendations to the Governor and, in accordance with § 2–1257 of the 22State Government Article, the General Assembly. 23On or before December 31, 2021, the Workgroup shall report its final 24findings and recommendations to the Governor and, in accordance with § 2–1257 of the 25State Government Article, the General Assembly. 26 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect July 27 1, 2020. It shall remain effective for a period of 2 years and, at the end of June 30, 2022, 28this Act, with no further action required by the General Assembly, shall be abrogated and 29of no further force or effect.
