# A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

## **Constitutional Amendment – Gaming – Expansion**

3 FOR the purpose of proposing an amendment to the Maryland Constitution to repeal a 4 certain prohibition on the authority of the General Assembly to authorize additional  $\mathbf{5}$ forms or the expansion of commercial gaming; repealing the authority of the General 6 Assembly to authorize, through the use of a certain referendum, additional forms or 7 the expansion of commercial gaming; conforming certain provisions of the Maryland 8 Constitution to changes made by a certain referendum; making a certain conforming 9 change; and submitting this amendment to the qualified voters of the State of Maryland for their adoption or rejection. 10

14 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, 15 (Three-fifths of all the members elected to each of the two Houses concurring), That it be 16 proposed that the Maryland Constitution read as follows:

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# Article XIX – Video Lottery Terminals

8 (i) Education for the children of the State in public schools, 9 prekindergarten through grade 12; and

10 (ii) Public school construction and public school capital 11 improvements.

12 (2) [Except as provided in subsection (e) of this section, the] **THE** State 13 may not authorize the operation of more than [15,000] **16,500** video lottery terminals in 14 the State.

15 (3) [Except as provided in subsection (e) of this section, a] A video lottery 16 operation license only may be awarded for a video lottery facility in the following locations:

(ii) Cecil County, within 2 miles of Interstate 95;
