A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

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Public Health – Health Care Professionals – Cultural Competency Coursework or Training

FOR the purpose of prohibiting a hospital or related institution, on or after a certain date, from employing or granting privileges to a certain health care professional unless the health care professional provides certain documentation; requiring, on or before a certain date and with a certain frequency thereafter, each health care professional to complete certain coursework or training and provide certain documentation to the appropriate board except under certain circumstances; requiring the Maryland Department of Health to adopt certain regulations that establish certain standards for certain coursework or training in consultation with the Cultural and Linguistic Health Care Professional Competency Program and certain organizations; requiring a certain board to exempt certain health care professionals from a certain coursework or training requirement; requiring certain boards to collect at a certain time a certain fee from each health care professional licensed by the board who is required to complete certain coursework or training; requiring certain boards to remit a certain fee to the Department to be used for certain purposes; prohibiting certain boards from renewing the license of a health care professional under certain circumstances; authorizing each board and the Department to adopt certain regulations; requiring the Department to adopt certain regulations on or before a certain date; altering a certain definition; and generally relating to cultural competency coursework or training for health care professionals.

 17 UNDER SUBSECTION (A) OF THIS SECTION AT THE TIME THAT THE HEALTH CARE
 18 PROFESSIONAL APPLIES FOR LICENSE RENEWAL.

 26 COURSEWORK OR TRAINING AS REQUIRED IN SUBSECTION (A) OF THIS SECTION,
 27 UNLESS THE BOARD HAS EXEMPTED THE INDIVIDUAL FROM THE COURSEWORK OR
 28 TRAINING REQUIREMENT UNDER SUBSECTION (C) OF THIS SECTION.
- SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That the Maryland Department of Health shall adopt the regulations required under § 1–803(b)(1)(i)1 of the Health Occupations Article, as enacted by Section 1 of this Act, on or before January 1, 2021.
