A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

2 **Child Support – Annual Collection Fee**

3 FOR the purpose of conforming the maximum amount of a certain annual fee for the
4 collection of child support by the Child Support Administration to the amount
5 authorized under a certain federal law; and generally relating to child support
6 collection fees.

12 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,
13 That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

14 **Article – Family Law**

15 10–110.

16 (a) The Administration may:

17 (1) charge an initial application fee of not more than \$ 25 for support
18 services;

19 (2) deduct from the child support payment to defray the cost of providing
20 support enforcement services under:

21 (i) the Income Tax Refund Intercept Program under this subtitle;

1 (ii) the Federal Treasury Offset Program;

2 (3) collect fees from the obligor to defray the costs of providing support
3 enforcement services; and

4 (4) deduct from child support payments an annual collection fee [of \$ 25]
5 **IN AN AMOUNT NOT EXCEEDING THE AMOUNT AUTHORIZED UNDER 42 U.S.C. §**
6 **654(6)(B)(II)** for cases in which the family never received temporary cash assistance and
7 has received at least \$ 3,500 in child support payments during the federal fiscal year.

8 (b) Except as provided in subsection (a) of this section, the Administration may
9 not:

10 (1) collect fees from the child support obligee; or

11 (2) deduct fees from the child support payment.

12 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
13 October 1, 2020.
