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## A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

2 **Crimes Involving Controlled Dangerous Substances – Penalties –**  
3 **Methamphetamine**

4 FOR the purpose of adding methamphetamine to a certain penalty provision applicable to  
5 certain crimes involving controlled dangerous substances; and generally relating to  
6 crimes involving controlled dangerous substances.

7 BY repealing and reenacting, with amendments,

12 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,  
13 That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

14 **Article – Criminal Law**

15 5–609.

16 (a) Except as otherwise provided in this section, a person who violates a provision  
17 of §§ 5–602 through 5–606 of this subtitle with respect to any of the following controlled  
18 dangerous substances is guilty of a felony and on conviction is subject to imprisonment not  
19 exceeding 20 years or a fine not exceeding \$15,000 or both:

- 20 (1) phencyclidine;
- 21 (2) 1–(1–phenylcyclohexyl) piperidine;
- 22 (3) 1–phenylcyclohexylamine;

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EXPLANATION: CAPITALS INDICATE MATTER ADDED TO EXISTING LAW.  
[Brackets] indicate matter deleted from existing law.



- 1 (4) 1-piperidinocyclohexanecarbonitrile;
- 2 (5) N-ethyl-1-phenylcyclohexylamine;
- 3 (6) 1-(1-phenylcyclohexyl)-pyrrolidine;
- 4 (7) 1-(1-(2-thienyl)-cyclohexyl)-piperidine;
- 5 (8) lysergic acid diethylamide; [or]
- 6 (9) 750 grams or more of 3, 4-methylenedioxyamphetamine (MDMA);

7 **OR**

8 **(10) METHAMPHETAMINE.**

9 (b) A person who is convicted under subsection (a) of this section or of conspiracy  
10 to commit a crime included in subsection (a) of this section is subject to imprisonment not  
11 exceeding 20 years or a fine not exceeding \$15,000 or both if the person previously has been  
12 convicted once:

13 (1) under subsection (a) of this section or § 5-608 of this subtitle;

14 (2) of conspiracy to commit a crime included in subsection (a) of this section  
15 or § 5-608 of this subtitle;

16 (3) of a crime under the laws of another state or the United States that  
17 would be a crime included in subsection (a) of this section or § 5-608 of this subtitle if  
18 committed in this State; or

19 (4) of any combination of these crimes.

20 (c) (1) A person who is convicted under subsection (a) of this section or of  
21 conspiracy to commit a crime included in subsection (a) of this section is subject to  
22 imprisonment not exceeding 25 years or a fine not exceeding \$25,000 or both if the person  
23 previously:

24 (i) has served at least one term of confinement of at least 180 days  
25 in a correctional institution as a result of a conviction under subsection (a) of this section,  
26 § 5-608 of this subtitle, or § 5-614 of this subtitle; and

27 (ii) if the convictions do not arise from a single incident, has been  
28 convicted twice:

29 1. under subsection (a) of this section or § 5-608 of this  
30 subtitle;

31 2. of conspiracy to commit a crime included in subsection (a)
