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Health Occupations – Dental Hygienists – Authority to Prescribe and Administer Medication

4 FOR the purpose of authorizing a dental hygienist who complies with certain provisions of $\mathbf{5}$ this Act to prescribe certain medications; prohibiting a dental hygienist from 6 prescribing certain drugs; prohibiting a dental hygienist from administering certain 7 medications; authorizing a dental hygienist who complies with certain provisions of 8 this Act to administer medication under a certain standing order and if the dental 9 hygienist includes certain information in a certain manner in the patient's record; 10 requiring a dental hygienist prescribing or administering medication as authorized 11 under certain provisions of this Act to prescribe or administer the medication under 12certain supervision and in compliance with certain regulations and provisions of law; 13 requiring a dental hygienist to complete certain educational requirements before 14 prescribing or administering medication as authorized under certain provisions of 15this Act: authorizing the State Board of Dental Examiners to adopt certain 16 regulations; establishing that the Maryland Pharmacy Act does not prohibit a dental 17hygienist from administering medications under certain provisions of this Act; 18 altering a certain definition; making a conforming change; and generally relating to 19dental hygienists and the authority to prescribe and administer medication.
