1 AN ACT concerning

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Public and Nonpublic Schools – Bronchodilator Availability and Use – Policy (Bronchodilator Rescue Inhaler Law)

4 FOR the purpose of requiring each county board of education and authorizing nonpublic 5 schools in the State to establish a policy to authorize certain school personnel to 6 administer bronchodilators to certain students under certain circumstances; 7 prohibiting a school nurse or other school personnel from administering a 8 bronchodilator to a prekindergarten student except under certain circumstances; 9 requiring a certain policy to include certain information; providing that certain 10 nurses and certain school personnel may not be held personally liable for certain acts 11 or omissions except under certain circumstances; requiring each public school to notify a certain student's parent or legal guardian, make a certain record, and file a 12 13 certain form under certain circumstances; requiring each public school to submit a 14 certain report to the State Department of Education using a certain form and on a 15 schedule required by the Department; requiring the Department to develop and 16 disseminate certain forms; defining certain terms; and generally relating to a 17 bronchodilator availability and use policy in public and nonpublic schools in the 18 State.

24 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND.

- 8 (c) The policy established under subsection (b) of this section shall include:
- 9 (1) Training for school personnel on how to recognize the symptoms of anaphylaxis, ASTHMA, AND RESPIRATORY DISTRESS;
- 11 (2) Procedures for the emergency administration of auto-injectable 12 epinephrine AND A BRONCHODILATOR;
- 13 (3) The proper follow–up emergency procedures;
- 14 (4) A provision authorizing a school nurse to obtain and store at a public school [auto-injectable] FOR USE IN AN EMERGENCY SITUATION:
- 16 (I) AUTO-INJECTABLE epinephrine [to be used in an emergency situation]; AND
- 18 (II) BRONCHODILATORS AND MODES OF DELIVERY, INCLUDING
 19 INHALERS WITH SPACERS; and
- 20 (5) A requirement that each public school develop and implement a method 21 for notifying the parents or guardians of students of the school's policy under this section 22 at the beginning of each school year.
- 23 (d) Except for any willful or grossly negligent act, a school nurse or other school 24 personnel who respond in good faith to the anaphylactic reaction, ASTHMA ATTACK, OR 25 RESPIRATORY DISTRESS of a child in accordance with this section may not be held 26 personally liable for any act or omission in the course of responding to the reaction.

- 30 (b) **(1)** Each nonpublic school in the State may establish a policy authorizing 31 school personnel to administer [auto-injectable]:

- 23 **(I) ANAPHYLAXIS** by a licensed health care practitioner who is authorized to administer auto-injectable epinephrine and who has been trained in an established protocol on how to recognize the signs and symptoms of anaphylaxis; **AND**

- 5 (II) BRONCHODILATORS AND MODES OF DELIVERY, INCLUDING 6 INHALERS WITH SPACERS;
- 7 (5) A requirement that the nonpublic school develop and implement a 8 method for notifying the parents or guardians of students of the school's policy under this 9 section at the beginning of each school year; and
- 10 (6) An ongoing process for oversight and monitoring by a licensed health care practitioner of the implementation of the policy established under subsection (b) of this section.
- 13 (d) Except for any willful or grossly negligent act, school personnel who respond 14 in good faith to the anaphylactic reaction, **ASTHMA ATTACK**, **OR RESPIRATORY DISTRESS** 15 of a child in accordance with this section may not be held personally liable for any act or 16 omission in the course of responding to the reaction.
- SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect July 1, 2020.
