11 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,
12 That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

13 **Article – Criminal Law**

14 10–304.

1 [Because of] **MOTIVATED EITHER IN WHOLE OR IN SUBSTANTIAL PART BY**
2 another person's or group's race, color, religious beliefs, sexual orientation, gender,
3 disability, or national origin, or because another person or group is homeless, a person may
4 not:

5 (1) (i) commit a crime or attempt or threaten to commit a crime against
6 that person or group;

7 (ii) deface, damage, or destroy, or attempt or threaten to deface,
8 damage, or destroy the real or personal property of that person or group; or

9 (iii) burn or attempt or threaten to burn an object on the real or
10 personal property of that person or group; or

11 (2) commit a violation of item (1) of this section that:

12 (i) except as provided in item (ii) of this item, involves a separate
13 crime that is a felony; or

14 (ii) results in the death of a victim.

15 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
16 October 1, 2020.
