1 There is a Sunday off-sale permit. (a) 2 Subject to [subsection (f) of this section and] subparagraphs (ii) (b) (1) (i) 3 and (iii) of this paragraph and except as provided in paragraph (2) of this subsection, the Board may issue the permit to the holder of: 4 5 1. a Class A beer, wine, and liquor license; or 6 2. a Class B beer, wine, and liquor license with an off-sale privilege. 7 8 Five Sunday off-sale permits may be issued only to holders of a 9 Class B beer, wine, and liquor license with an off-sale privilege that acquired the license 10 on or after January 1, 2016. Sunday off-sale permits may be issued to holders of a Class A 11 (iii) 12 beer, wine, and liquor license that acquired the license on or after January 1, 2016. 13 The Board may not issue a Sunday off-sale permit to a license holder 14 that the Board finds to have sold liquor on Sunday without a Sunday off-sale permit. The permit authorizes the holder to sell alcoholic beverages for off-premises 15 16 consumption on Sunday from 8 a.m. to midnight. 17 (d) Except as provided in paragraph (2) of this subsection, an applicant for (1) 18 the permit shall commit in the application to reinvesting a minimum of \$50,000 in the 19 business within 1 year after the permit is issued. 20 (2)(i) The Board may waive the reinvestment requirement. 21The Board shall waive the reinvestment requirement for a holder (ii) 22 of a Class B beer, wine, and liquor license with an off-sale privilege that acquired the 23 license on or after January 1, 2016, if the holder can show that a minimum of \$50,000 was 24reinvested in the business within the 3-year period immediately preceding the submission of the application. 25 26 The Board shall revoke the permit if: (3)27 (i) the Board did not waive the reinvestment requirement under paragraph (2) of this subsection; and 28 29 (ii) the permit holder fails to make the required reinvestment.

If the permit is issued to the holder of a Class B beer, wine, and liquor license

with an off-sale privilege, the holder need not comply with any restaurant or food

- 1 (f) Not more than 105 Sunday off-sale permits may be in effect at any one time. 2 The application fee for the permit is \$750. (g)] (1) 3 (2) The annual fees for the permit are: (i) \$2,590 for the holder of a Class A beer, wine, and liquor license; 4 5 and 6 \$1,080 for the holder of a Class B beer, wine, and liquor license (ii) 7 with an off-sale privilege. 8 The fees listed in paragraphs (1) and (2) of this subsection are in (3)9 addition to the annual fee for the Class A beer, wine, and liquor license or Class B beer, 10 wine, and liquor license to which it is attached.
- SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect July 1, 2020.
