# Real Property – Condominiums and Homeowners Associations – Governing Bodies

4 FOR the purpose of requiring the governing body of a condominium to convene at least a  $\mathbf{5}$ certain number of meetings each year; requiring the developer of a condominium to 6 appoint a certain person to the board of directors for the council of unit owners within 7 a certain period of time after the date a certain number of units is conveyed under 8 certain circumstances; requiring the developer of a condominium to establish a board 9 of directors if no board of directors has been established under certain circumstances; 10 requiring a developer to deliver certain notices regarding a certain bond to certain 11 individuals within a certain period of time; requiring a council of unit owners to keep 12books, records, and accounts beginning on the date the council is established; 13 requiring a council of unit owners to maintain certain books, records, and accounts 14in a certain manner; making certain provisions of law applicable to the accounts of a 15condominium; requiring a declarant to appoint a certain person to the governing 16body of a homeowners association within a certain period of time after the date a 17certain number of lots have been conveyed under certain circumstances; requiring a 18 declarant to establish a governing body of a homeowners association if no governing 19body has been established under certain circumstances; requiring a declarant to 20deliver certain notices regarding a certain bond to certain individuals within a 21 certain period of time; requiring the governing body of a homeowners association to 22convene at least a certain number of meetings each year; requiring a homeowners 23association to maintain books, records, and accounts beginning on the date the 24homeowners association is established; requiring a homeowners association to 25maintain certain books, records, and accounts in a certain manner; making certain 26provisions of law applicable to the accounts of a homeowners association; and 27generally relating to the governing bodies of condominium councils of unit owners 28and homeowners associations.
