- 20 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,

2	(g) The Council shall:
3 4 5	(1) ensure that the State's procurement system is utilizing the mos advanced procurement methods and management techniques, including policies procedures, and forms for all procurement activity and contract management;
6 7 8	(2) effect and enhance communication between State units on procuremen matters, with an emphasis on disseminating information on current developments and advances in procurement methods and management;
9 10	(3) provide a forum for the discussion of specific procurement issues and problems that arise, including:
11	(i) procurement officer training;
12	(ii) risk analysis and insurance requirements;
13 14	(iii) management of eMaryland Marketplace and other Interne procurement resources;

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1 In addition to any other provision of law, the following persons shall use (a) 2 eMaryland Marketplace to publish notice of a procurement or publish a notice of award of 3 a procurement that is at the same amount or exceeds the amount required by the Board for 4 a State contract to be published in eMaryland Marketplace: 5 (1) a unit of State government; 6 (2)a county; 7 (3) a municipality; 8 **(4)** a bicounty or multicounty governmental agency; 9 a special tax district, sanitary district, drainage district, soil (5)conservation district, and water supply district; 10 11 (6)a public institution of higher education; 12 a public school; [and] (7)13 except for the Maryland Health and Higher Educational Facilities Authority, an entity exempt from the provisions of this Division II in accordance with § 14 11-203 of this article; AND 15 16 **(9)** A HOSPITAL THAT RECEIVES STATE FUNDS AND SEEKS TO ENTER 17 INTO A CONTRACT FOR SERVICES, SUPPLIES, OR CONSTRUCTION-RELATED 18 SERVICES. 19 This section may not be construed to prohibit a person listed in subsection (a) 20 of this section from publishing notice of a procurement or publishing a notice of award in 21accordance with any other law or policy. 22 An unintentional violation of this section may not constitute grounds to 23challenge or appeal: 24(1) the award of a procurement; or 25 (2)the process through which a procurement was conducted. SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That, on or before December 31, 262021, the Procurement Improvement Council shall submit a report to the Senate 27 28Education, Health, and Environmental Affairs Committee and the House Health and 29 Government Operations Committee, in accordance with § 2–1257 of the State Government

- 3 (2) guidelines on how to identify entities that do not comply with the 4 requirement to publish notices of procurement and awards of procurement on eMaryland 5 Marketplace and the reasons why the entities do not publish the required notices and 6 awards; and
- 7 (3) recommendations on strategies and enforcement mechanisms to 8 improve compliance by entities required to publish notices of procurement and awards of 9 procurement on eMaryland Marketplace, including any necessary legislation to authorize 10 or implement the strategies and enforcement mechanisms.
- SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect July 1, 2020.
