A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

2 Office of the Attorney General – Health Insurer Concentration – Study

FOR the purpose of requiring the Office of the Attorney General to conduct a study to examine health insurer concentration in the State to determine the competitiveness of the market; requiring the Office of the Attorney General to take certain actions in conducting the study; requiring the Office of the Attorney General to submit its findings and recommendations to the Governor and certain committees of the General Assembly on or before a certain date; and generally relating to health insurer concentration in the State.

10 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, 11 That:

12 (a) The Office of the Attorney General shall conduct a study to examine health 13 insurer concentration in the State to determine the competitiveness of the market.

- 14 (b) In conducting the study, the Office of the Attorney General shall:
- 15 (1) examine insurer concentration by both region and product level;
- 16 (2) determine if there is a correlation between health insurer concentration 17 and market power in terms of:
- 18 (i) premium costs and the effect on affordable and available services19 for consumers; and
- 20 (ii) reimbursement rates for health care providers and pharmacists; 21 and
- 22 (3) make recommendations to address inequities between health care

2 (c) On or before December 1, 2020, the Office of the Attorney General shall submit 3 its findings and recommendations to the Governor and, in accordance with § 2–1257 of the 4 State Government Article, the Senate Finance Committee and the House Health and 5 Government Operations Committee.

6 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect July 7 1, 2020.
