## A BILL ENTITLED

### **Correctional Services – Elder Parole**

3 FOR the purpose of authorizing the release of a certain elder inmate on parole at any time 4 during the term of the inmate's sentence, without regard to certain factors;  $\mathbf{5}$ establishing a means of initiating a request for parole with the Maryland Parole 6 Commission under this Act; requiring the Commission to provide certain notice to a 7 certain inmate under certain circumstances; requiring the Commission to conduct a 8 certain hearing under certain circumstances; establishing a rebuttable presumption 9 that a certain inmate is suitable for parole; providing that a certain presumption may be rebutted in a certain manner; providing for the applicability of provisions of 1011 law concerning victim notification and participation in parole proceedings conducted 12under this Act; requiring the Commission to adopt certain regulations to implement 13 provisions of this Act; defining a certain term; and generally relating to elder parole.

THE TERM OF THE INMATE'S SENTENCE, WITHOUT REGARD TO THE ELIGIBILITY 1 STANDARDS SPECIFIED IN § 7–301 OF THIS SUBTITLE.  $\mathbf{2}$ A REQUEST FOR PAROLE UNDER THIS SECTION SHALL BE IN WRITING 3 **(C)** AND MAY BE FILED WITH THE MARYLAND PAROLE COMMISSION BY: 4 (1)  $\mathbf{5}$ THE INMATE SEEKING PAROLE UNDER THIS SECTION; OR 6 (2) AN ATTORNEY. 7 FOLLOWING REVIEW OF THE REQUEST, THE COMMISSION SHALL: **(D)** 8 (1) PROVIDE NOTICE TO THE INMATE IN THE MANNER PROVIDED IN § 7-303 OF THIS SUBTITLE; AND 9 10 (2) CONDUCT A HEARING TO DETERMINE IF THE INMATE IS SUITABLE FOR PAROLE IN THE MANNER PROVIDED IN § 7–307 OF THIS SUBTITLE. 11 THERE IS A REBUTTABLE PRESUMPTION THAT AN ELDER INMATE 12**(E)** (1) 13IS SUITABLE FOR PAROLE. 14(2) THE PRESUMPTION MAY BE REBUTTED BY A DETERMINATION BY 15A COMMISSION PANEL THAT A FACTOR OR FACTORS CONSIDERED UNDER § 7–305 OF THIS SUBTITLE MAKE THE INMATE UNSUITABLE FOR PAROLE. 16 17THE PROVISIONS OF LAW RELATING TO VICTIM NOTIFICATION AND **(F)** 18 **OPPORTUNITY TO BE HEARD APPLY TO PROCEEDINGS UNDER THIS SECTION.** 19 (G) THE COMMISSION SHALL ADOPT REGULATIONS TO IMPLEMENT THE 20**PROVISIONS OF THIS SECTION.**
