A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

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Pharmacists – Aids for the Cessation of Tobacco Product Use

3 FOR the purpose of authorizing a pharmacist who meets the requirements of certain 4 regulations to prescribe and dispense certain aids for the cessation of the use of $\mathbf{5}$ tobacco products; requiring the State Board of Pharmacy, on or before a certain date, 6 to adopt regulations establishing certain procedures and conditions relating to the 7 prescribing and dispensing of certain aids for the cessation of the use of tobacco 8 products; requiring the Maryland Medical Assistance Program and the Maryland Children's Health Program to provide coverage for certain services rendered by a 9 licensed pharmacist under this Act to the same extent as certain services rendered 1011 by any other licensed health care practitioner; altering a certain definition; and 12generally relating to the prescribing and dispensing of aids for the cessation of the 13 use of tobacco products.

4 (A) A PHARMACIST WHO MEETS THE REQUIREMENTS OF THE REGULATIONS 5 ADOPTED UNDER THIS SECTION MAY PRESCRIBE AND DISPENSE MEDICATIONS 6 APPROVED BY THE U.S. FOOD AND DRUG ADMINISTRATION AS AN AID FOR THE 7 CESSATION OF THE USE OF TOBACCO PRODUCTS.

8 (B) (1) ON OR BEFORE SEPTEMBER 1, 2021, THE BOARD SHALL ADOPT 9 REGULATIONS ESTABLISHING:

AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 13October 1, 2020.

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
