A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

Real Estate Appraisers and Real Estate Appraiser Trainees – Licenses and Certificates – Experience, Renewal, and Reinstatement Requirements

4 FOR the purpose of altering the number of hours of experience required of an applicant to $\mathbf{5}$ qualify for a real estate appraisal license or a certificate for residential or general 6 real estate appraisal; altering the time period during which an individual may apply 7 for reinstatement of a license to provide real estate appraisal services or a certificate 8 to provide certified real estate appraisal services; authorizing the State Commission 9 of Real Estate Appraisers, Appraisal Management Companies, and Home Inspectors 10 to reinstate a certain license or a certain certificate under certain circumstances; 11 altering the number of terms for which a real estate appraiser trainee license may 12be renewed; repealing a provision of law requiring a real estate appraiser trainee 13licensee to pay a certain fee to renew a license; requiring the Commission to reinstate 14 the license of a real estate appraiser trainee if the trainee meets certain 15requirements; and generally relating to real estate appraisers and real estate 16appraiser trainees.
