A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

2 **Economic Development – Maryland Technology Infrastructure Program**

3 FOR the purpose of establishing the Maryland Technology Infrastructure Program in the
4 Maryland Technology Development Corporation; establishing the purposes of the
5 Program; establishing the Maryland Technology Infrastructure Authority; providing
6 for the appointment of members, the selection of officers, and the purposes and
7 procedures of the Authority; establishing the Maryland Technology Infrastructure
8 Fund as a special, nonlapsing fund; specifying the purpose of the Fund; requiring the
9 Executive Director of the Maryland Technology Development Corporation or the
10 Executive Director’s designee to administer the Fund; requiring the State Treasurer
11 to hold the Fund and the Comptroller to account for the Fund; specifying the contents
12 of the Fund; providing for the investment of money in and expenditures from the
13 Fund; requiring interest earnings of the Fund to be credited to the Fund; exempting
14 the Fund from a certain provision of law requiring interest earnings on State money
15 to accrue to the General Fund of the State; requiring the Program to provide certain
16 financial assistance to certain entities in the State subject to certain conditions;
17 providing for the eligibility of certain entities for certain financial assistance;
18 establishing certain priorities for certain financial assistance; requiring the
19 Authority to adopt certain regulations; requiring the Corporation and the Authority
20 to report to the Governor and the General Assembly on or before a certain date each
21 year; defining certain terms; declaring the intent of the General Assembly; specifying
22 the terms of the initial members of the Authority; and generally relating to the
23 Maryland Technology Infrastructure Program, the Maryland Technology
24 Infrastructure Authority, and the Maryland Technology Infrastructure Fund.

19 (1) MARYLAND'S STRONG BASE OF INNOVATION-LED, ADVANCED
20 INDUSTRIES IS IN PART A RESULT OF THE STATE'S INVESTMENT IN
21 INNOVATION-FOCUSED ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT PROGRAMS, THEREBY
22 ESTABLISHING ITSELF AS A NATIONAL LEADER;

23 (2) MARYLAND'S TWO LEADING ADVANCED INDUSTRIES OF LIFE
24 SCIENCES AND CYBER-RELATED INDUSTRIES CONTINUE TO GENERATE

6 (II) AT LEAST TWO SHALL BE EXECUTIVES IN CYBER-RELATED
7 COMPANIES IN THE STATE.

8 (2) THE GOVERNOR SHALL CONSIDER THE GEOGRAPHIC DIVERSITY
9 OF THE STATE WHEN APPOINTING MEMBERS.

10 (C) THE MEMBERS APPOINTED BY THE PRESIDENT AND THE SPEAKER:

11 (1) MAY NOT BE ELECTED OFFICIALS; AND

12 (2) MUST HAVE EXPERIENCE AND EXPERTISE IN LIFE SCIENCES OR
13 CYBER-RELATED INNOVATION.

14 (D) EACH MEMBER MUST BE A RESIDENT OF THE STATE.

15 (E) (1) THE TERM OF AN APPOINTED MEMBER IS 4 YEARS.

16 (2) THE TERMS OF THE APPOINTED MEMBERS OF THE AUTHORITY
17 ARE STAGGERED AS REQUIRED BY THE TERMS PROVIDED FOR MEMBERS OF THE
18 AUTHORITY ON OCTOBER 1, 2020.

19 (3) AT THE END OF A TERM, AN APPOINTED MEMBER:

20 (I) IS ELIGIBLE FOR REAPPOINTMENT; AND

21 (II) CONTINUES TO SERVE UNTIL A SUCCESSOR IS APPOINTED
22 AND QUALIFIES.

23 (4) A MEMBER WHO IS APPOINTED AFTER A TERM HAS BEGUN SERVES
24 ONLY FOR THE REST OF THE TERM AND UNTIL A SUCCESSOR IS APPOINTED.

25 (5) A MEMBER APPOINTED BY THE GOVERNOR MAY BE REMOVED BY
26 THE GOVERNOR WITH CAUSE.

27 (6) A MEMBER APPOINTED BY THE PRESIDENT OF THE SENATE MAY

1 BE REMOVED BY THE PRESIDENT OF THE SENATE WITH CAUSE.

21 ETHICS COMMISSION WHETHER THE MEMBER IS EMPLOYED BY OR HAS A FINANCIAL
22 INTEREST IN AN ENTITY THAT MAY APPLY FOR FUNDING FROM THE FUND.

13 (2) THE STATE TREASURER SHALL HOLD THE FUND SEPARATELY,

21 DIRECTOR'S DESIGNEE, SHALL ADMINISTER THE FUND IN ACCORDANCE WITH THIS
22 PART AND ANY OTHER APPLICABLE LAW.

13 **(IV) ESTABLISH THE STATE AS A KEY LOCATION FOR LIFE**
14 **SCIENCES AND CYBER-RELATED INDUSTRIES.**

12 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That:

13 (a) The terms of the initial members of the Maryland Technology Infrastructure
14 Authority appointed by the Governor under § 10–495.5(a)(1) of the Economic Development
15 Article, as enacted by Section 1 of this Act, shall expire as follows:

16 (1) one member in 2021;

17 (2) two members in 2022; and

18 (3) two members in 2023.

19 (b) The terms of the initial members of the Authority appointed by the President
20 of the Senate of Maryland and the Speaker of the House of Delegates shall expire in 2024.

21 SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
22 October 1, 2020.
