CHAPTER

1 AN ACT concerning

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Maryland Arts and Culture Capital Grant Program

3 FOR the purpose of establishing the Maryland Arts and Culture Capital Grant Program; 4 requiring the Maryland State Arts Council to administer the Program and hire a 5 certain coordinator; requiring the Governor, for certain fiscal years, to include in the 6 State operating or capital budget an annual appropriation of at least a certain 7 amount for the Program; authorizing certain organizations to apply for certain 8 grants; prohibiting certain organizations from receiving from the Council, in any 9 fiscal year, a grant for a single project that exceeds a certain amount; requiring 10 certain organizations, under certain circumstances, to match a certain amount of the grant awarded; authorizing the Council, under certain circumstances, to waive the 11 12 match requirement; requiring the Council to establish a competitive application 13 process for the Program; providing for the contents of the application; requiring the Department of Commerce to establish, by regulation, a quantitative system to 14 15 evaluate each application that takes into account certain information; requiring the 16 Council and a grant recipient to execute a certain program agreement; stating the 17 intent of the General Assembly; and generally relating to the Maryland Arts and 18 Culture Capital Grant Program.
