State Government - Open Meetings - Requirements and Application of Open
 Meetings Act
 (Maryland State Agency Transparency Act)

5 FOR the purpose of providing that the Maryland Technology Development Corporation is 6 subject to the Open Meetings Act; requiring certain State agencies to make publicly 7 available on their websites open meeting agendas a certain amount of time in 8 advance of each meeting or, under certain circumstances, as far in advance of the 9 meeting as practicable; requiring certain State agencies to post on their websites 10 certain meeting minutes not more than a certain number of days after the minutes are approved; requiring certain State agencies to make publicly available live video 11 12 streaming of each portion of a certain meeting; requiring certain State agencies to 13 maintain certain meeting minutes and recordings on their websites for a certain number of years after certain meetings; requiring the Maryland Stadium Authority, 14 under certain circumstances, to make publicly available live audio streaming of each 15 16 portion of a certain meeting; altering the requirements regarding minutes of and the 17 posting of information regarding meetings of the State Board of Elections; making 18 conforming and technical changes; and generally relating to open meetings of State 19 agencies.


