(j) The legislative body of a municipal corporation may: 1 (1) $\mathbf{2}$ (i) prohibit littering; and 3 classify littering as a municipal infraction under Title 6 of the (ii) Local Government Article. 4  $\mathbf{5}$ (2)The governing bodies of Prince George's County, Calvert County, and 6 Montgomery County may each adopt an ordinance to prohibit littering under this section 7 and, for violations of the ordinance, may impose criminal penalties and civil penalties that 8 do not exceed the criminal penalties and civil penalties specified in subsection (f)(1) through 9 (3) of this section. 10 The governing [body] BODIES of Prince George's County AND (3)(i) CHARLES COUNTY may EACH adopt an ordinance to prohibit the disposal of a bulky item: 11 121. on a highway; or 13 2. on public or private property unless the property is 14designated by the State, a unit of the State, or a political subdivision of the State for the 15disposal of bulky items and the person is authorized by the proper public authority to use 16 the property.
